

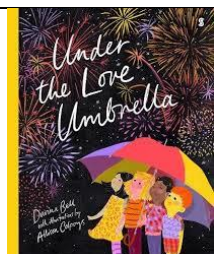
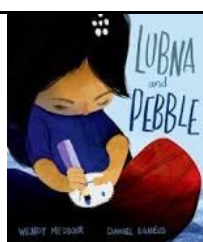
RSE Day 2020 book list:

‘Books I love about love’

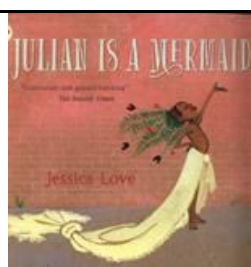
Ages 7 to 11

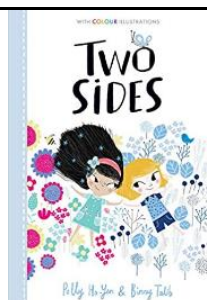


Julian is a Mermaid by Jessica Love, illustrated by Jessica Love (Walker Books)

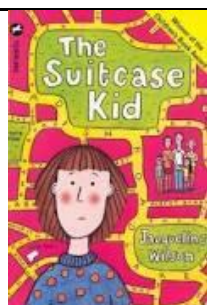


Two Sides by Polly Ho-Yen, illustrated by Binny Talib (Stripes Publishing)
